THE FRESHMAN PICNIC CLASS OF 2022

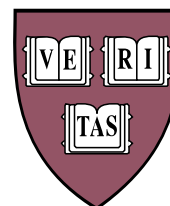

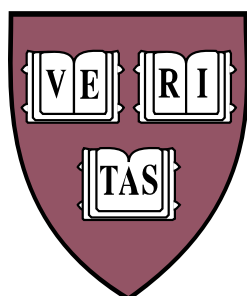
